Our Mission

Our mission is to raise awareness and funds for research studies of targeted therapies that shut down the activators of childhood cancers.



Doctors diagnosed Braden Hofen with stage IV Neuroblastoma at just 3 years old.

Neuroblastoma is a solid mass tumor often found in the adrenal glands. Braden's tumor was so large it was pushing organs out of its way. Braden had extensive surgeries, round after round of high-dose chemotherapy, radiation, a bone marrow transplant and countless other treatments over the next 18 months. He knew the hospital as "home" and spent the majority of his days enduring harsh treatments designed to save his life. At 5 years old, Braden's Neuroblastoma relapsed. While other parents were preparing for the milestone of starting kindergarten, Braden and his family were told there was "no known cure" for relapsed Neuroblastoma. His survival odds fell to less than 10%.

Unbelievably, Braden's mom, Deliece, was diagnosed with stage II Breast Cancer shortly after Braden's relapse. Mother and son were now fighting cancer together and even had chemotherapy on the same days in two different Kansas City locations.

Because there was "no known cure" for Braden's cancer, doctors ordered empirical treatments with unknown results. Despite the poor odds, the treatments worked. Afterwards, Braden's doctors could find no evidence of disease and both he and his mom were in remission. Braden began daily treatments designed to keep his cancer at bay. And for a few years, Braden and his family looked for joy in the little things, despite all that they endured-until 2013.

Braden was 8 years old when he faced yet another deadly disease: a secondary form of Leukemia caused by the treatments designed to save his life from Neuroblastoma. Doctors told the family they had never seen a child survive this form of Leukemia after relapsed Neuroblastoma. But, Braden embodies hope and had proven them wrong before. Braden's only option for a cure was a bone marrow transplant. Braden's 10 year old brother Zach, was a perfect match, underscoring what the Hofens know all too well, that families fight cancer and all that comes with it together.

True to form, Braden survived and continues defying the odds today.

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2019 Braden's Hope Award

Midhat Faroogi M.D., Ph.D.

Director, Molecular Oncology Children's Mercy Genome Center

Dr. Farooqi's project seeks to help children with hard-to-treat and/or recurring solid tumors found in a range of pediatric cancers like neuroblastoma and Ewing sarcoma. His research focuses on T cells, a type of immune cell that circulates in our bodies and scans for microbes and abnormal cells. Dr. Farooqi seeks to improve a new and targeted therapy that uses a patient's own T cells which are engineered in a lab and infused back into the body to treat these aggressive tumors. Thanks to Braden's Hope, Dr. Farooqi hopes to enhance this treatment's effectiveness by sequencing a patient's DNA first to help pre-determine the tumor's response to this therapy. His project includes patients at Children's National Medical Center in Washington, D.C., Children's Health in Dallas, Texas, Cook Children's in Fort Worth, Texas, and even children being treated for these cancers in Mexico.

2018 Braden's Hope Award

John M. Perry, Ph.D.

Research Faculty, Children's Research Institute

Hematology/Oncology/BMT

Dr. Perry's project seeks to repurpose a classic chemotherapy drug—doxorubicin—to help the body's own immune system kill therapy-resistance leukemia stem cells. These leukemia stem cells are resistant to most therapies, partly because they are especially good at evading and resisting the immune system. By using doxorubicin in a better, more targeted manner, Dr. Perry's lab found they can reactivate anti-cancer immunity by stimulating the immune system to "seek and destroy" these cancer stem cells. Thanks to Braden's Hope, Dr. Perry expects this work will one day eliminate cancer stem cells and provoke an immune response that will effectively vaccinate patients against relapse.

2017 Braden's Hope Award

Tomoo Iwakuma, M.D., Ph.D.

Frank B. Tyler Professor of Cancer Research

Adjunct faculty, Department of Molecular & Integrative Physiology, KUMC

Director, Translational Laboratory Oncology Research Program, Children's Research Institute
Thanks to funding from Braden's Hope, Dr. Iwakuma has recently identified a new compound that
induces cell death in cancer cells lacking the tumor suppressor p53. Since over 50% of human cancers
and specifically about 80% of osteosarcoma cancers lose p53 activity, Dr. Iwakuma's compound has the
potential to kill only those cancer cells lacking the p53 tumor suppressor, all with minimal side effects to
healthy cells. His research also shows that this compound can stop the growth of osteosarcoma tumors.
Currently, Dr. Iwakuma's team is modifying the chemical structure of this compound so it can be more stable
in the human body and can kill cancer cells lacking p53 activity more effectively. The team consists of more
than 10 researchers and Dr. Iwakuma is quick to point out that without this support from Braden's Hope, his
research would not have progressed as far as it has in less than two years.
